This was followed by 400 years of prophetic silence. I wonder what it must've been like in those 400 years? The animal sacrifices continued, the High Priest continued to minister and make atonement for the people's sins. Just think what it would be like to not hear from God. The Holy Spirit was not yet given to the people. But then the silence was broken by the angel Gabriel! He appeared to a priest named Zachariah whose wife Elizebeth was barren and they were both well advanced in years. The angel told him, your wife is going to conceive and give birth to a son and you shall call his name John.
